Finance

The accounts from February from Derek are as follows: No deposits or withdrawals.

Greenbelt Funds: £7,908.58

General Funds: £2,725.53

Total Funds: £10,634.11

Whilst the wall at the cross was being replaced, the village display board became water damaged. John has since fixed the sign and is now back in its usual position. John will give Derek the receipts for the equipment to repair the display board and will be reimbursed costs.

Planning

- There has been some movement of the concrete blocks at Carnbooth Hotel however we are unsure of the purpose of this.
- 20 Picketlaw Farm Road have put in planning permission for a single storey extension.
- 32 Busby Road have put in planning permission for new roof and dormer window to side of house.

Roads and Lighting

- Continue to report all issues to the 'MyGlasgow' App.
- Bailey McCabe has heard back from the roads departments, and he has been told that Waterside Road should be resurfaced 2024/2025. He is going to push for a more specific date and state it should be done as soon as possible, this side of July.
- John sent pictures to the Councillors of the road at Craigsheen when it recently froze over, The Councillors are continuing to chase up getting the drains fixed.
- The drain at Hillcrest (the old bus stop) is scheduled to be checked before the end of March.
- Councillor Morgan requested information from the council regarding who owns Pedmyre lane which has been unanswered, twice. John noted that all fly tipping has been collected by Glasgow Council apart from the concrete blocks.

Transport

- Marion told the CCM that she checked the times for the bus and found three different times being advertised.
- Councillor Vallis raised the concerns around the bus card not being needed/scanned and they have informed her they have no intention of reducing the bus routes in the area.
- Marion is going to pursue FirstBus about getting the 75/5 to come past Carmunnock.

Linn Area

- £1 Million has been secured in the infrastructure fund. The next meeting the funds can be allocated.
- Bailey McCabe will continue to pursue a permanent Christmas Tree.

AOB

- Gary the Ranger has retired but is going to be replaced.
- Bailie Morgan holds a surgery the first Monday of the month in the Castlemilk Hall from 6-7pm. She welcomes all residents to come and pass on their concerns which she can act upon or pass on at community council meetings.
- Bailie Morgan spoke to the conveyor for the 'MyGlasgow' App and has been informed that 'completed' means the issue has been moved to a 'will do' list rather than being completed. John suggested this wording is not appropriate and implies the job has been completed. He noted that it is not an issue with the software but the underlying business rules.
- Marion was invited to an Emissions Meeting and will attend to highlight the issue Carmunnock faces regarding transport.
- Councillor Vallis is going to find out how many council homes are in Carmunnock after Ashley wondered if any of the Councillors or Members knew.
- Ashley is going to talk to Carmunnock Primary School about having the children create the 'pick up your dog poo' signs for the park.
