Finance:

- No change from last month. Total funds: £10,466.69
- Payment for the questionnaire leaflet and Christmas tree event to be paid.

Planning

- There has been a renewal of the multiple occupancy on Waterside Road.
- The building on Busby Road is causing major road and traffic issues. A village resident has contacted the building company to highlight these issues.

Roads and Lighting

- The whole at the corner of Picketlaw Drive and Craigsheen avenue should be filled in and opened on Wednesday the 11th.
- Many drains have still not been cleared in the village.
- Large pothole on busby road at the temporary lights has been reported on the app.
- The flickering light on Cameron Crescent has now been fixed.
- Councillor McCabe has escalated the flooding on Windlaw Road.
- Fly tipping had been reported on Pedmyre Lane and collected promptly.
- Cathkin Road to be resurfaced on the bend. Councillor McCabe has been chasing this up, still forecast to be completed by end FY
- Please continue to report all concerns around roads and lighting to your My Glasgow app.

Transport

- Marion experienced the new, electric, 31 bus. She said it was a very pleasant experience.

Linn Area Committee:

- Most of the monies have been allocated for the year.

AOB

- The Christmas tree lighting event was well attended, and the tree looks nice. We still intend to plant a permanent tree funded by the NRS (neighbourhood regeneration services).
- The Wheatley Housing Association within the village is now no longer supported living.
- Gallowhill road has experienced many acts of anti-social behaviour over the past few years. Cars have been scratched, people have been filmed and shouted at along with land ownership disputes. If anyone experiences or witnesses these behaviours, please report to the police.
- John is going to fix the notice board as it was damaged during the recent heavy winds.
