Planning

- No planning updates

Roads and Lighting

- The old Carnbooth driveway has rubbish - from the gatehouse that has been renovated at the beginning of the road - dumped further down the road by those who were contracted to dispose of the rubbish. This has been reported to the police. The road also has a tree that has fell from the past storm. Bailie McCabe will chase both issues up.
- The development on Busby road is causing a build up of aggregate at the side of the road narrowing the road. John is going to contact planning; Councillor McCabe is going to contact the developers and get the to tidy as they carry out the building work.
- Drains on Picketlaw Farm Road have still not been cleared. Bailey McCabe is going to investigate this.
- Residents of the village effectiveness of the drain on Craigsheen road being replaced and that it has made a difference to the flooding in that area.

- Bailie Morgan was not present to discuss the retaining wall on Busby Road.
- There has been a traffic mirror erected at the end of Stewart road, however the angle is slightly off so still take care pulling out of this road.
- Hillcrest drainage work and resurfacing has been completed.
- The bend on Cathkin road has been completed
- BailieMcCabe is going to look into the practicalities of CCTV being installed at the end of Pedmyre Lane as fly tipping is still an issue.
- Glasgow City Council have done a very good job on cleaning up Carmunnock bypass.

Transport

- New electric buses have been complimented on their comfort and appearance.
- If getting the bus you should check latest times on FirstBus website or on their app.

Carmunnock Forum and Website

- Heidi is going to post the results of the survey on the Carmunnock website.
- The survey has allowed village groups to use this as evidence of services and resources needed within the village.

Linn Area Committee

- The village got around 40% of the LAC budget this year.
- The Castlemilk Hall, Gala Committee, Heritage Society and Carmunnock Primary School were all awarded grants.

AOB

- Heidi is getting a set of keys for the notice board as its needing some TLC.
- Community council is still in discussion about bringing back the welcome packs.
- GCC is putting £20 million into roads and increasing their requirement for area workers. They are also not reducing their teacher levers, keeping their teacher levels at the 2023 number. They have also raised £1 million from LEZ zone fines.
- The village clean up will be held on the 18th of May at 1pm. Litter pickers, bin bags, gloves and high viz vests will be provided along with juice and a treat after the event.
